Featuring 12 rounds with the best 7 scores to count, it is planned that there will be an equal number of sealed and non-sealed surface stage rallies. It is appreciated that many competitors have either gravel or sealed surface prepared vehicles. With good scores, contenders may win by competing in just one discipline and not necessarily both, as has been the case in previous years. Any vehicle permitted on qualifying rounds is eligible. (Please also see Item 17). There will be an award for the best individual combined score supported by RJD Motor Services, if competing as a Driver and Co-driver throughout the year.

The challenge will have an innovative points scoring system as detailed in Item 5.

By registering, you will be supporting Wales Air Ambulance Charity No. 1083645 with a minimum of £3 of your £10 registration fee being donated to the Charity, in

addition to fundraising efforts MDMC organise. Since the inception of the Rally Challenge in 2013, over £17,000 has been donated to the charity

The fee of £10 will also include Maesteg DMC Membership with the full benefits of the Club including voting rights. Challenge Registration is free to MDMC members already fully paid up for 2025.

It is preferable that Contenders state Maesteg DMC as their Club for entry lists that include Club names but, as a Motorsport UK registered Championship, this is not compulsory. If a contender wishes to drive and co-drive throughout the Challenge they need pay only once and should make every effort to inform the Challenge Coordinator before entering an event to assist in calculating their points tally.

The Challenge Co-ordinator or a fellow organiser will make every effort to attend named rounds to allow competitors to register until one sealed and one non-sealed surface rally has taken place. After this period, organisers are not bound to attend but competitors may register throughout the year. Registration may then be done by post or electronically using the payment methods detailed on the Registration Form. You may register before the day of your first event which will assist organisers and help gain pre-season publicity.

Scores per round will be 30 points for 1st Overall and 1st in Class then 28, 26, 24, 23, 22, 21 down to 8 points for 20th in class or lower. This will also apply if Classes are amalgamated. Five points will be awarded for a non-finish but zero points for a disqualification. If a contender completes a 'Trophy Rally' having retired from the rally earlier, they will be awarded 5 points. Points will be awarded according to the <u>Rally</u> Class Position in the results of each round. E.g. a Contender achieving 3rd in Class on an event will earn 26 points regardless of whether 1st and 2nd in Class are Challenge contenders. This will eliminate the scenario of a contender 'cruising' to a finish to achieve maximum Challenge points if they are likely to be the only finisher or their position is uncontested in said Class. Your class points will be added toward an overall score which means that you can compete in various classes throughout the year. On events which have sections where Class positions are not posted, eg Junior F1000, a competitors overall position will be deemed their Class position.

Points will be calculated using the final results list on which every finisher is included, not on lists of Class positions. This is due to previous occasions when through error, Final and Class lists have differed. It is therefore very important that you check that your correct Class position is shown on provisional results posted on events prior to them being made final. Contenders who achieve 1st overall will gain the same points as 1st in Class. If an event has a Top 3 where class positions are not stated, contenders will earn the same points as a competitor listed as the first in their class in the final results.

Best combined score for a contender who drives and co-drives throughout the year: The RJD Motor Services Two Seats Trophy, replica and £95. Aside from this Trophy, contenders other than Juniors may only win one of the above awards which will be given in order of greatest monetary value.

1 st Co-Driver	Cup, replica and £100.

A Junior contender must be under 25 years of age on 1/1/2025 and is able to win more than one award. Whether Junior contenders may win more than two awards will be at the organisers discretion.

Ties will be decided by Class positions in the results of the first round competed on. If a tie exists, the 2nd, 3rd and 4th round competed on, and so on. If a tie still exists then it will be decided on Class position on the 1st stage of the first round competed on, then 2nd, 3rd and so on until the tie is resolved.

As a courtesy to our sponsor, every effort must be made by Award Winners to attend the Presentation Evening. If not possible you may nominate someone who has purchased a ticket to receive your award. If you fail to nominate someone, at the organiser's discretion, you may forfeit your prize money which may be added to the Wales Air Ambulance 2025 donation. You will be credited in publicity for the donation.

Each contender should carry Challenge Decals provided, on both sides of the vehicle and, as a courtesy to the sponsor, make an effort to keep them visible. They will each measure approximately 22cm x 21 cm. It is the responsibility of the Contender to obtain new decals should they become damaged or they compete in a different car. If a Challenge official is present on a round and witnesses that decals are not displayed, points for that round may be forfeited if it is deemed that an adequate attempt to obtain them has not been made. All replacement stickers will be provided free of charge. In the spirit of which the Rally Challenge is run, complaints received by the promoters that Challenge decals are not displayed, will not be entertained.

£10 registration <u>includes</u> Maesteg DMC Membership email: <u>rallychallenge@live.co.uk</u> Registration form on Website: www.<u>rallychallenge.co.uk</u> (Item 10 is also applicable for the claiming of Celtic Micra Challenge points) Motorsport UK have granted permission to include one round outside mainland Wales, England and Scotland of the contender's choice to substitute a named Challenge round, i.e. rallies only accessible by sea or air. THE CONTENDER MUST NOMINATE THIS ROUND <u>BEFORE</u> tackling Stage One and the event must begin no later than, November 2nd 2025. <u>It is the contenders responsibility to provide overseas</u> <u>event results to the Challenge Co-ordinator in order to gain points.</u> Only one rally may be nominated and must be recognised by the motor sport governing body of said country.

Reserve events:

To comply with NCR Chapter 3, Appendix 10, Article 4.1(a-d)", in the case of cancellation of a qualifying round, reserve events are already named on the Calendar. Cancelled events or those subject to a date change may be replaced by named reserve events only. The Championship has a total of 12 rounds, some of which will take place on Ministry of Defence property. The Ministry of Defence, because of operational commitments, may have to withdraw the availability of a venue, sometimes at short notice. The Championship Organisers reserve the right to accept a date change of a championship event, should it be forced on the organisers due a Ministry of Defence venue becoming unavailable on the original date. This rule is laid down under guidelines from the Motorsport UK after consultation with the WAMC. If Motorsport UK relax the rule on date changes for events not on MOD Land, the organising Committee will decide on whether to take advantage of this relaxation if and when such an occurrence takes place. In this case, the change of date will be announced at the Rally Challenge website and organisers may, but are not bound to, inform contenders by e mail.

It is a competitor's responsibility to notify the Challenge Co-ordinator of any change of contact details.

-13-

Contenders are asked to submit any queries regarding points, which are to be found at <u>www.rallychallenge.co.uk</u> as soon as possible after each event and it is their responsibility to ensure that the query has been received. A date when the results become final will be announced on the release of the provisional results following the last round.

-14-

In case of further disruption as occurred during the pandemic, it is necessary to include the following wording - Promoters have the right to cancel the Championship if three Gravel and three Sealed Surface Rounds are unable to take place.

-15-

Registering for the Rally Challenge signifies acceptance of the Rules.

-16- (As requested by Motorsport UK) 12.1 By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1).

12.1.1. Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

3.1.2. It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report to Motorsport UK. Provision is made on the TCS Challenge Registration Form where you must state that you are a Celtic Micra Challenge Contender.

Item 10 re nominating an optional overseas event is applicable.

There will be a dedicated page which will include latest points and features, accessible via the home page of <u>www.rallychallenge.co.uk</u>

To become Overall Micra Challenge Champion Driver and Co-driver, contenders have to compete on a minimum of one gravel **and** one sealed surface round.

Mr. Justin Fowler Bishop will oversee the Celtic Micra Challenge with regard to awards, collation of points, decals, sponsor support and publicity.

Only Nissan engined Micra's are eligible.

There will be no additional fee for Micra Challenge contenders.
